

Nap Time

RULES: Practical Shooting Handbook, Latest Edition **COURSE DESIGNER:** Thomas Howard

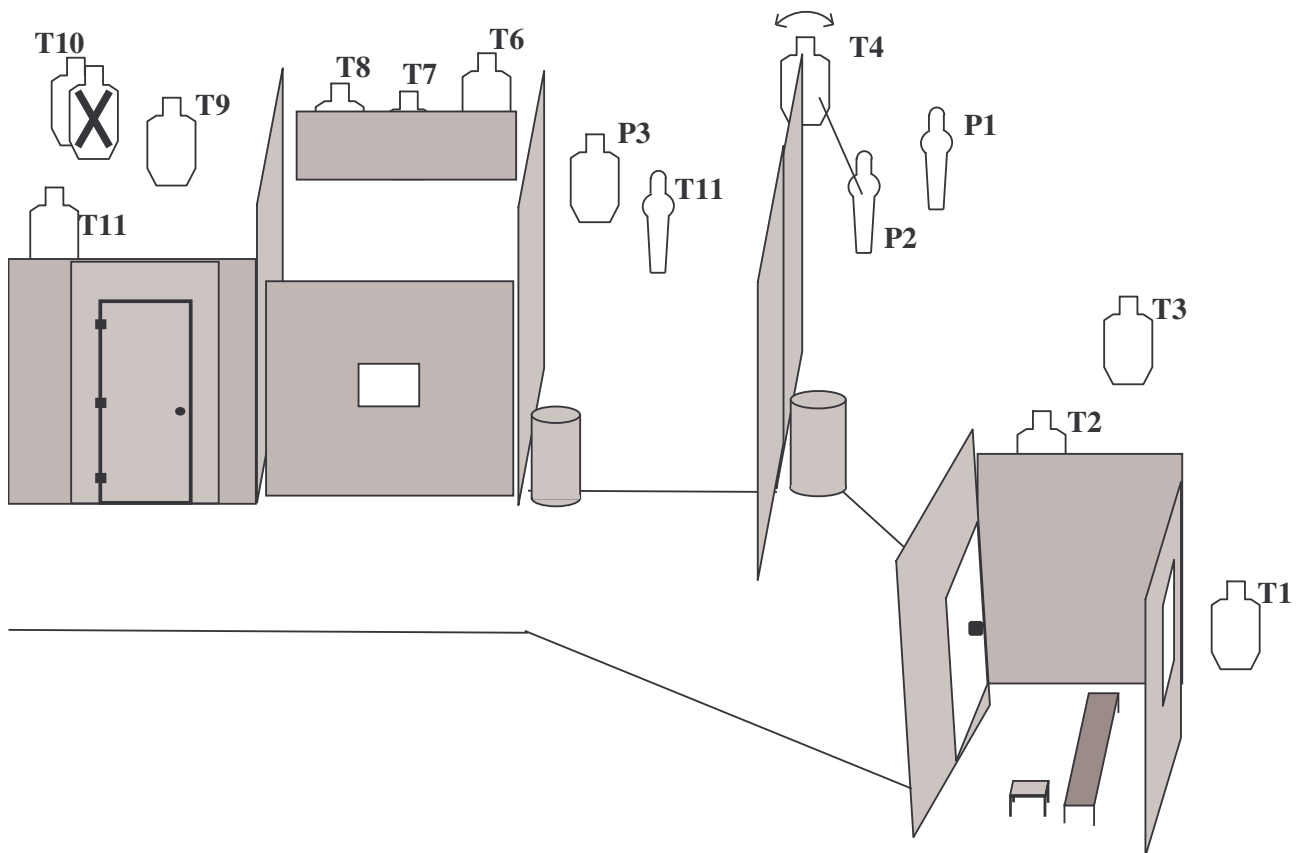
START POSITION: Shooter begins lying supine on cot with ankles crossed and hands on stomach. Firearm is on table beside cot. Firearm has magazine inserted, no round chambered, and the slide is forward and the hammer is down. Firearm may not be propped. No magazines may initially be on shooter's person—all additional magazines are to be placed on either or both of the two barrels.

STAGE PROCEDURE

At start signal, retrieve your firearm, and engage targets as they become visible from within the fault lines.

SCORING

SCORING: Comstock, 25 rounds, 125 points
TARGETS: 11 IPSC, 3 Steel
SCORED HITS: 2 Best per IPSC, steel down = 1A
START-STOP: Audible - Last shot
PENALTIES: Procedural. -10
 No-shoot hit. -10
 Miss. -10



SETUP NOTES: T1 is visible from sitting position on cot through window, but not from doorway. Initial doorway opens outward. T2 is immediately around the corner. P2 is forward-falling, and activates the swinging T4 target. T4 should swing such that it is visible from either side of the barrier wall. The left-side door is also a fault line—shooters may not go through the doorway. Left-side door opens inward.
